Application Deadline: March 20, 2012

Nelle Peterson was a founding member and the first President of the Louisville Craftsmen's Guild, the oldest art guild in Kentucky. She was a former Director of the Art Center in Louisville. Nelle was a well respected teacher who gave much to developing young students who are professional artists today. We owe her our gratitude and wish to remember her through our Nelle Peterson Memorial Art Scholarship. We are pleased to offer this scholarship to help high school seniors with their first year in college.

In 2003 the name of the guild was changed to the Louisville Artisans Guild to better reflect our purpose and membership.

The Scholarship is an endowment fund administered by The Community Foundation of Louisville. The fund is invested for long-term growth, and only a portion of the fund is used for scholarships each year. The scholarship is a one time award of \$1,500 made available to a graduating senior who plans to major in art or a related field. The scholarship recipient is also awarded an Artisans Guild membership.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. A 2.0 GPA out of a possible 4.0 from a Metro Louisville-area high school (Jefferson, Oldham, Shelby, and Bullitt Counties in Kentucky and Floyd, Clark, and Harrison Counties in Indiana.)
2. An official high school transcript or a letter that indicates you are a documented home-schooled student in your school district.
3. Portfolio of 5 works of art by the student with signature covered. If your work is at National Gold Key competition, you may bring slides of that work and have 5 original pieces submitted.
4. 2 letters of reference, including one from high school teacher in art, photography, textiles or fashion design and other art related fields.
5. A 200-300 word essay describing educational career goals.
6. Completed application form.
7. Name of the college you plan to attend. If you have been accepted, please include a copy of your acceptance letter.

The LAG Scholarship Committee reserves the right to request further information, expanded portfolio of work, before making a final decision.

## SELECTION PROCESS

The name of the applicant will not be disclosed to committees, but will be identified by an assigned number only. Please cover names on artwork whenever possible. No committee member may be related to any applicant nor may any member be acquainted with any applicant in more than a casual manner.

Upon reviewing all applications, the preliminary committee of 5 LAG member artists will evaluate each application on a 1 (low) to 10 (high) scale in the following areas:

1. Scholarship merit
2. Creativity
3. Craftsmanship
4. Originality

The highest and lowest scores of each applicant shall be dropped and all scores totaled and averaged by the committee chairman. The top 20% (or 3 if less than 8) of the applicants will be reviewed and discussed by the preliminary committee. This committee will then make recommendations to the final selection committee to determine the winner. The final committee is composed of one member of the preview committee and two CFL members.

The first runner-up shall also be noted and the name retained in the event the winner is unable to accept the scholarship or attend school.
